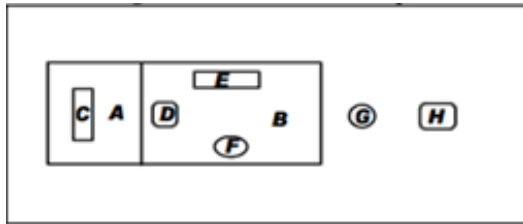
Lean In

9. The practices described in vv. 6,7 indicated what, according to v8? Explain the significance of this.
10. What purposes were Old Testament sacrifices not able to accomplish?
